San Carlos Elementary School District \$176M Bond Tax: Argument Against - Measure

In 2012, voters approved \$72,000,000 in bond debt to:

"...upgrading science and computers labs, providing computers, repair school facilities and technology...."

That "technology" is now obsolete and needs replacing--but as part of a \$176,000,000 loan plus 16 30-40 years' payments, more than doubling the cost to \$352 million or more.

How? Bond interest rates can rise to 12%! 8

Bonds are like mortgages: huge loans requiring payments—of both principal and interest. 13

What is this new bond measure for? -

"...repairing aging classrooms and upgrading science labs, technology...."

Have you ever paid for a PC with a 30- to 40-year loan? 14

No? Well, that's what San Carlos School District proposes. That technology will be obsolete in 12 4-6 years, but you will pay for decades. Perhaps your grandchildren will, too, if they inherit 17 your home.

<u>Vote NO</u> to tell <u>San Carlos Elementary School District's</u> trustees that **the place for known**, 1 <u>recurring expenses</u> is their <u>annual budget</u>—not <u>decades-long debt burdens on children and 14 grandchildren.</u>

Next: Have they <u>earned</u> the right to collect additional taxes, costing residents \$176 million (on 15 top of the taxes you and your neighbors already pay)?
