Rebuttal to The Argument Against Measure E

We're disappointed two people who don't live or vote in Woodside would make such inaccurate and misleading statements, and that they did this to all schools on the San Mateo 151 County ballot. Measure E is absolutely needed and a sound investment in our local Woodside 13V School. 141 As longtime residents and local business owners we're voting YES. Here are the facts: 141 Woodside School is the #1 ranked school in our county, with student in scores far 3V

- exceeding state averages. Our community has always supported schools, but it has been 10 years since our last bond, 160 and Woodside School is aging. A lot of work was accomplished, but more is needed to ensure ALL classrooms are safe and meet current educational standards - which regular maintenance simply does not cover. No other funding exists to appropriately repair Woodside School.
- Measure E ensures eligibility for State matching funds.
- Measure E is LOCALLY controlled for Woodside School. By law, no funds can be taken by the State or used for administrator salaries.
- Woodside School District's high standard of fiscal responsibility gives them a AAA credit score, the highest possible.
- Measure E requires strict independent citizens' oversight and mandatory audits to ensure funds are spent as promised.
- Measure E is the result of two years of planning, including a detailed community-built Facilities Master Plan.
- People move here and stay in large part because of our local schools. Over the years, enrollment numbers fluctuate which is normal.

We all benefit from living in a community with high performing schools. Measure E ensures Woodside School continues to support high quality education.
